Our Own Big Give

Last month was a big month for giving on behalf of our congregation. The Outreach Ministry issued checks in April to our partners at NNEMAP, Freedom al a Cart, Starr House, the Open Shelter, and Habitat for Humanity and Women Affirming Women. Collectively, these gifts totaled \$12,000. In January we sent \$2,000 to Trinity Episcopal for the Layette Ministry. So far this year, on your behalf, Outreach has sent out \$14,000 in gifts. Thank you to everyone who has donated to Outreach to make this possible.



Last month we thanked everyone for their generous donations to the book drive. A group of Outreach Ministry Members, Formation Members and Youth Group Members delivered the books to NNEMAP several weeks ago. We had 197 books for the adults and 387 children or youth books for a grand total of 584 books weighing 569 pounds. That should give the NNEMAP clients reading material for quite some time!

We were thrilled to be able to do this for NNEMAP, but it was even more special to undertake this joint project between Outreach and Youth Group. We hope we will be able to do more of these joint projects.






There are several good news items from NNEMAP. First, visits to NNEMAP and other food pantries in Central Ohio are dropping. That means our economy is improving and folks are getting back to work. Second, due to the generosity of its support network, NNEMAP is going to be purchasing a van. This will help with both food pickups from local groceries and the Mid-Ohio Food Bank. It will also help with home deliveries to shut in clients.

St, Mark's has agreed to help NNEMAP with a new project. To increase the use of vegetables by their clients, NNEMAP is going to put together kits for chili and spaghetti sauce. The kits will contain everything needed for the finished product as well as instructions on how to do so. St. Mark's has agreed to put together spice packets for the kits.

As the weather warms, CATCH Court participants will be meeting for lunch in the park prior to CATCH Court. Our next regularly scheduled day would be May 13 (weather dependent). If you would like to help the St. Marks team with a lunch, contact Pat lams.

Freedom's new café and bakery is open in downtown Columbus at 123 East Spring St. The new facility provides training opportunities for the participants of CATCH and the Butterfly Group. They learn how to maintain employment, as well as various restaurant and catering skills. It provides reentry into the employment sector for many of the women in the program.

The café is open for breakfast and lunch. If you have the chance, stop buy and show them some support. Try a coffee or the Don't Judge Me sandwich.



Freedom at Home continues to provide delivery of pre-made meals ready to cook and eat in your home in less than 30 minutes. This is a once a week service. Several of the Outreach Ministry members have started ordering the meals and indicate the meals are delicious and easy to finish in your own kitchen. If you are tired of cooking and would like to try this service, order from Freedom at Home on line at freedomalacart.org/freedomat-home. Meals for two are just \$25.

VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITY

Sometimes the CATCH clients need rides to places, such as; appointments, or transportation to court. If you are interested in providing the occasional ride, talk to Pat lams and she will connect you with the Freedom/ Catch team.

EMPOWERING MOMS GROUP

Freedom is starting an "Empowering Moms Group" Their hope is that the women in CATCH and Butterflies will take advantage of this free parenting resource where they can come together with other moms to learn constructive ways to more effectively parent and feel empowered through their interactions with each other.



STILL NEED A FEW VOLUNTEERS TO MAKE BIRTHDAY BAGS

The Women's Respite program is back this year after a COVID hiatus. For those of you who aren't familiar with Women's Respite, it is a retreat hosted for up to 25 low income single moms. This year it will be a three-day twonight stay at Ohio Dominican University July 23-25. It will be packed with fun, crafts, spas, and wonderful meals and snacks. One of the most fun activities is a surprise birthday party during lunch on the last day, complete with birthday cake. At that time, the team presents each participant with a Birthday Bag filled with all sorts of goodies just for them. St. Mark's women have been asked to provide twelve bags. In the past, members have paired up to fill a bag, although if you care to do one yourself, that's fine. You might expect to spend \$50-75 to fill a bag. Below is a list of suggestions you might want to include in your bag. Please know that you don't need to include everything on the list. They are suggestions only. I will supply the actual bags. Please contact Anice Ellis at 614-529-9597 if you wish to sign up or have questions. Let's help to make a group of single moms happy. After all, some of these women may never have had a birthday party or get gifts for their birthdays.

HIS PLACE DINNERS

St John's Town Street also serves a weekly dinner to those in need. While the dinner used to be in the parish hall, since COVID, dinner has been a to go bag handed out from the sidewalk outside the church. On April 21^{st.} St. Mark's provided a chili dinner. The Homeless Families Foundation is a Columbus-based non-profit organization whose purpose is to help stabilize families who are homeless or marginally housed. They do this with an extensive network of support to provide for safe housing, financial, educational, mental health and training opportunities. You may recall they were the group that assisted the homeless teen featured on the Sixty Minutes segment about Columbus. They helped her secure an apartment. The HFF believes education is the key to ending homelessness. In the summer they run educational enrichment programs for youth from kindergarten through middle school. They also run a program to get children ready for school. They use a rapid re-housing model that moves families into permanent housing and then provides case management until the family is stable. They impact over 700 families and 1000 youth annually.

In pre-pandemic times, The Homeless Families Foundation, sponsored a festive Mother's Day Brunch which was a gathering to treat mothers (most of them single parents) who were striving to stabilize their families. It was a much anticipated time of celebration for these mothers and children. This year, since gatherings of large groups are not feasible, The Homeless Families Foundation is holding a virtual fundraiser to boost their care of these families.

Anice Ellis's Story

Anice Ellis combines personal devotions and communal activities as she travels on her Christian journey.

Her recent induction into the Society of St. Simeon and St. Anna indicates she's on the right path. The society celebrates the wisdom, experience, maturity and achievements of lay and clerical members of the Diocese of Southern Ohio who are 60 and older.

Anice and her husband, Michael, joined Saint Mark's after moving in 1997 to central Ohio, where their two children were living. Michael had retired from a career as an Episcopal priest and family and individual therapist; he died last Sept. 15.

The Episcopal church has played a big role in their lives. Anice is serving her third stint as a Vestry member; she also has served as Senior Warden. Plus, she's a member of the current Saint Mark's Rector Search Committee; she had served on the previous search committee when Paul St. Germain was called as rector.

She enjoys helping manage parish affairs. "Vestry is like a close family and the congregation are all relatives," she said.

"I am very much a people person, so I really like to be involved." Church work provides "affirmation, reassurance," a way to connect to her faith, she said.

Do lay people have a calling similar to ordained members? "Oh definitely yes. I've always felt called to serve the church. My most humbling experience was when we first moved here, I was a chalice bearer. It was so moving to look into the faces of my fellow Christians, my friends, and offer the chalice."

Anice starts her day with reading and prayers. She reads from the Episcoplian publication Forward Day by Day and Mornings with Jesus, a Guideposts publication. Her favorite is A Year of Days with the Book of Common Prayer, written by former Presiding Bishop Edmond L. Browning.

She calls her devotional activities "communication with our Lord. It is inspiration to go forward."

And, she expresses her faith in a quiet but meaningful way: "I wear a butterfly pin on my shoulder, every day, almost every day, which I have done for many years. It is my way of expressing that I am a Christian. I'm not the type to stand on a street corner and wave a Bible, but I can express my Christianity through my butterfly pin by telling people what it symbolizes: the Resurrection of Christ.

"As I have gotten older, I can see where God is in my daily life," Anice said.

"God is my light and life."


