# **Vestry Meeting**

April 11, 2023

The meeting was called to order at 7:32 pm by Cheryl Boop. Vicki Zust led Vestry in an opening prayer. Cheryl welcomed all.

**1. MINUTES** of the March 2023 meeting were reviewed. Several typos were corrected. Upon **motion**, **seconded and passed**, the minutes were approved as corrected.

### 2. Reports

### a. Rector's Report: Vicki

- i. Mostly devoted to Lent activities and future planning
- ii. Vicki will be attending a conference at the Fred Rogers Institute June 16/17 Vicki will miss Father's Day "Brats and Floats"
- iii. Vicki will be on vacation July 9 16th.
- iv. Question: What is Bruce's title Priest associate: He does not want to be listed in the bulletin as such unless he is actually serving. He will fill in for Vicki's vacation.
- v. 8:00 AM Service Should it be outside in the summer or not? Vicki polled those who go to that service and the response is evenly split. Vicki will decide. Possibly a shorter summer season. Having coffee outside would give the church a presence in the community.
- vi. The groundbreaking for the community center is Monday at 4:00 PM. There will be a mosaic on the wall of pictures of those who donated \$250 or more. St. Mark's will be represented by a picture of the bell tower,
- vii. The high school International Baccalaureate class from UA visited the church for a tour and a lesson about how the Episcopalian Church fits into Christianity and the community. It went well.

### b. Senior Warden's Report (Cheryl)

- i. Nothing to report. It was wonderful to see how many people attended both Sunday services on Easter. There were 198 at 11:00, and 160 170 at 9:00AM. The Vigil had more than 70.
- ii. Congregants did a good job of welcoming new people. We need to work on the engagement part of it.

# c. Junior Warden's Report (Kevin)

- i. A meeting has been scheduled for the grounds committee. They will meet tomorrow. It will include a walk-through of the AV system. They will formulate a list of projects for the coming year.
- ii. The leak in the roof was repaired for \$600 less than the quote.

# d. Treasurer's Report (Phil)

- i. The numbers look good
- ii. A lot of pledges came in early. Income is at 41% of the annual pledges. Non pledge income is up also. Two families are regular donors that don't pledge. The budget is on track for the year.
- iii. Expenses are at or below budget. We are above budget on administrative expenses, but cash is not a problem.
- iv. Insurance includes more than typical P&C coverage. It includes many forms of liability. The church is covered by the insurance offered by the Episcopal Church.

# b. Organ Recital Reception – April 30 (Barb and Ted) 4:00

- i. A sign-up genius being posted for set up, clean up and goodies. The audience will include members of the community, not associated with St. Marks. It is being advertised to the American Organists Guild.
- **ii.** Michael and his husband both have birthdays on April 27<sup>th</sup>. We will do something to recognize that. (Birthday cake?) Sing "Happy Birthday."

# c. Culture and Artisan's Fair – May 6 (Brenda and Barb)

- i. Brenda has it well organized. George and Ellen oversee set up and clean up. They are looking for djembe players. Afternoon music is a jazz ensemble from the Upper Arlington High School. There will be food from S. Africa, and Mexican food. Vicki has sent out press releases. Vicki will send the bulletin announcement to the Vestry so we can share. If it rains, it will be in the parish hall. CRIS is our partner. This is the first year for this festival. The goal this year is simply for it to happen. We are hoping it will grow over time. It is well supported by Upper Arlington City.
- ii. There will be food trucks. Their fee is waived.
- iii. The jazz ensemble will receive an honorarium.

- i. Andi is checking into having children's formation doing hat making.
- ii. We need an article in the Epistle, the deadline is next week. Vicki needs details for This Week and the bulletin.
