### Flowering of the Cross

Saint Mark's parishioners and visitors can once more demonstrate their Easter joy by participating in the flowering of the cross on Easter morning. The activity will be held before the 9 and 11 a.m. Easter services, with the cross located in front of the chapel, where the Giving Tree is located during Advent. The Flower Guild will provide flowers for everyone to use.

Flowering the cross is said to date to the 6th century. "The flowering of the cross is a visual representation of the victory of Christ over death. We use the cross on Good Friday to remember Jesus's death. Adding flowers to it on Easter brings symbols of life to a symbol of death," Pastor Vicki said.

### CELEBRATING LENT, HOLY WEEK, AND EASTER AT SAINT MARK'S

### Lent

On Wednesday evenings in Lent we are offering a three part program. You can choose to participate in one, two, or all three parts.

- 5:30 p.m. **Simple Soup and Bread Supper.** There will be a sign-up sheet in the Parish Hall so folks can take turns providing soup and bread each week.
- 6:15 7:15 p.m. **Pysanky Egg Workshop.** Pysanky is the art of applying wax to eggs and then dying them. It is a multi-step process and ends with beautiful eggs ready for Easter. Join us in the Parish Hall.
- 7:30 7:45 p.m. **Compline.** Compline is the night prayer of the church. It has been prayed by Christians for over a thousand years. We will gather in the church for Compline.

The Wednesday evening program will be held: March 6, 13, and 20.



A Children's Easter Egg Hunt will take place after the 9 am service with separate areas for toddlers and older kids to have fun. The eggs are stuffed with a combination of toys and candy.

7:30 p.m. – This day commemorates the Last Supper and the giving of the great commandment mandautum in Latin, where the name of the day comes from. The Eucharist for this service ends with the stripping of the altar. The reserve sacrament will be in the chapel for private devotion following the service and on Friday. ### Saint Mark's Hosts AARP Tax-Aide Program

Each year during February, March and April, several days a week our parish hall is a beehive of activity. This is our partnership with the AARP Foundation Tax-Aide program.

Since 1968 the AARP Foundation Tax-Aide program has provided free tax-preparation help to more than 78 million taxpayers, with 1.6 million taxpayers being helped in 2023 alone. It is the largest program of its type in the nation. They focus on adults who are over 50 with low to moderate incomes, but the program is open to everyone on-a first-come first-served basis. No membership is required and there are no fees. It provides in person assistance with tax return preparation and tax filing, access to tax filing software and on-line coaching, although our location is just in-person preparation and filing.

Why does this service matter? Well, taxes are complicated. As a result, many taxpayers overpay, turn to services they can't afford, or don't file at all, thus missing out on credits and deductions they have earned. The program provides a lifeline to refunds for many with a need. In 2023, Tax-Aide participants received more than \$1.1 billion in refunds and credits, with older low-income adults saving more than \$564 million.

When the program first started, they had just four sites. It has grown to 4,000 sites with over 26,000 IRS-certified volunteers. In central Ohio we have 12 sites, one of which is located at Saint Mark's. At our site, there are eight tax preparers plus a client specialist and a scheduler. Last year they completed more 325 returns and are scheduled to do as many this year.

The Saint Mark's site is run completely by volunteers. Each year the preparers receive more than 20 hours of annual training before they see their first taxpayer. They must pass online exams monitored by the IRS. Then throughout the tax season they volunteer a minimum of four hours per week with most volunteers giving the program several days a week for the entire tax season. While completing their work, they must strictly follow protocols set by the IRS.

It is Saint Mark's pleasure to provide the space for the Upper Arlington site, and to be associated with this wonderful program that provides so much to our community. If you would like to have your taxes done, please note that appointments are required and they go quickly. The number to call is 614-359-8194.

### Tri- Village Packers

The Tri-Village Packers was founded last year because there are children in Upper Arlington and Grandview Heights that rely on school lunches and are at risk of going hungry over school breaks. Tri- Village Packers includes groups and individuals who already work with the UA and Grandview Heights schools.

The group's first big project was packing up food boxes for almost 100 children to use over the Thanksgiving break. They are gearing up to do it again over spring break. You can make a donation to this cause or sign up to volunteer with the spring-break food distribution at the Tri-Village Packers website trivillagepackers.com

The Packers also are working with the schools to ensure that there is food available in each building for children who come to school hungry. Saint Mark's will focus on our neighbor, Tremont Elementary. Watch this space for more details on the project.

### PASTORAL CARE - GRIEF SUPPORT

### Healing, Hope, and New Life

Grief is a common human experience, yet each grieving person has a unique and personal reaction to loss. I've heard people describe their grief as similar to:

- riding an emotional roller coaster with no seatbelt.
- having a wildfire rip through their life leaving devastation behind,
- going over a waterfall into a raging whirlpool and swirling around helplessly,
- being in a fierce storm that is trying to blow down the door of their safe home, or
- climbing a rocky mountain path with unknown hazards ahead.

These descriptions can help you better understand the pain and anxiety of loss and explain to others what you

are feeling. They can also help you start to develop tools for healing. In grief, healing doesn't mean the loss never had an impact or that it didn't matter — it means the loss no longer

controls your life. The first step in healing grief is finding a safe place with non-judgmental people where you can share your story. As others listen, without trying to "fix" you, you'll find gradual relief from the sometimes-overwhelming feelings that are a normal part of grief. And you'll learn who the most supportive individuals in your life are and discover ways to let them help you.

For example, grieving people often feel a sense of hopelessness and become lonely and isolated. Questions like "What now?" and "Does anything matter?"" swirl in your mind creating a feeling of emptiness. The loss of hope after a death blocks your ability to live fully, but how do you move from emptiness towards a point where the future is not something to endure but an opportunity for living well while walking every day with loss? Elizabeth Kubler-Ross said, "Grief transforms the broken soul". Her quote helps frame Lent as a time for thinking about hope and moving towards it in a grief support group or with supportive friends. Sharing with others helps you slowly

explore hope after loss and consider the possibility that life itself is worth living. As Martin Luther King, Jr. says, ""But I know, somehow, that only when it is dark enough can you see the stars."

Achieving healing and finding hope require you to mourn the life you thought you were going to have with the person who died. Early after loss the idea of a fulfilling life without your loved one can be distressing and overwhelming. The distress may come from your belief that finding happiness would be disloyal to the person who died. You're also likely putting a lot of energy into surviving each day and adapting to multiple changes in your roles and responsibilities - and this can make you feel overwhelmed and exhausted. All these and other emotions may make the thought of creating a meaningful future seem like a very bad joke.

Yet, an important task in grief is to find meaning for your life after a death. The Easter message of resurrection, renewal and hope can be a reason to think about how you will

live and, with time and healing, accept the future as a place where you can have a new relationship with your loved one.

Come to Saint Mark's Grief Support Group and spend some time with others who are working through grief after a death. We will meet from 9:30 a.m. to 10:30 a.m. on Saturday, March 9 in the church office. For more information contact Brenda Hammersley at **b.hammersley@yahoo.com** or 614-330-1436. ### 2024 ANNUAL MEETING

Saint Mark's leaders sketched a portrait of a thriving church during presentations at the Annual Meeting, held Feb. II in the parish hall. Participation in Sunday services is up, budgets are healthy and, as Pastor Vicki said in her report, "There seems to be something going on nearly all the time."

Average Sunday Attendance for 2023 was 137 inperson, which means in-person worship has returned to its pre-pandemic level. Plus, the church now has a new attendance category: those who worship through our website's livestream, something which did not exist before the pandemic. Average livestream attendance was 168, based on those viewing services either live or between Sunday afternoon and Tuesday afternoon, multiplied by an average of 1.5 persons per viewing device.

Financially, 2023 was "an exceptional year," Treasurer Phil Glandon said, with pledged revenue, unpledged donations and investment earnings much better than expected. Revenue increases plus lower-than-budgeted expenses created a \$176,000 positive swing in finances. On another note, upcoming major maintenance and repair projects means the church will consider a capital campaign, Pastor Vicki said.


Our congregation is active in myriad ways, such as the Culture and Artisans Fair, assisting in outreach programs for those in Columbus and in southern Ohio, supporting a vibrant music program and increasingly opening our doors and church campus to the surrounding community, according to Senior Warden Cheryl Boop. "We meet everyone where they are," she said.

Strengthen them when they stand; comfort them when discouraged or sorrowful; raise them up if they fall; and in their hearts may thy peace which passeth understanding abide all the days of their lives; through Jesus Christ our Lord.
