## **OUTREACH & SOCIAL JUSTICE**

## **Episcopal Community Ministries Grant**

Over the last decade, Saint Mark's Outreach Ministry expanded its efforts in Vinton County, an isolated and poor rural area, and now provides layettes, infant- care items, school supplies, grooming items and feminine hygiene products to county residents. The ministry expansion called for a new title to describe a robust program. In January, Saint Mark's Outreach Ministry applied for and was awarded a \$5,000 grant from Episcopal Community Ministries for Saint Mark's Vinton County Ministry (VCM). (Formerly called the Appalachian Children's Project, the name change was made due to increasing needs of infants, children, and women in Vinton County.)

On April 6, Barb Keyes and the Saint Mark's team leads for VCM met with representatives from the Help Me Grow program of the Vinton County Department of Health, who shared a need for items to support families with infants born prematurely. There has been an increase in premature births over the last several months. Because these infants require special equipment and there are currently no resources to support them, part of the grant money was applied to the purchase of infant car seats for babies weighing less than four pounds, vibrating bouncy seats that stimulate infant neurological development, and several strollers designed for smaller infants. Money from this grant and the items Saint Mark's was able to donate will enable Vinton County's Help Me Grow team to support this special population. They also enjoyed sharing information with the congregation about their program and what our support means to them.

## **Update on Prior Outreach Summits**

There was good attendance and discussion at the March Outreach Update. Thanks to all who attended! At the January Summit, attendees provided information on their community activities outside of Saint Mark's and provided suggestions on other outreach activities they'd like the Outreach Ministry to consider.

The Outreach Administrative Committee continues to process that information. One thing that became very clear at the January Summit is that Saint Mark's parishioners volunteer with a wide range of community "charitable" activities- such as Pelotonia, the Red Cross, ForeHope, Rotary, ESL, Seeds of Caring, and school tutoring. Even though Saint Mark's can't be involved in every worthwhile local organization, we strive to support all parishioners in their volunteer work. The Administrative Committee and the New Ideas team would like to help parishioners connect with others who are like-minded. We are open to suggestions as to how we might do this better.

The next Outreach Update will take place at 9:30 a.m. Sunday, June 2, in the parish hall. Program Leaders will provide updates on their ministries, a report about our second annual Culture and Artisans Fair, and a review of the Outreach budget.

## **UA Farmer's Market Begins May 15**

The Upper Arlington Farmer's Market is coming, basically, to Saint Mark's this season. Dorset Road will close between Reading and Tremont. Market stalls will line the sidewalk right in front of Saint Mark's along Dorset; some market activities will take place on our front lawn.

This means a few things for Saint Mark's:

Parking. We will need to have all cars off Dorset Road by I p.m. on Wednesdays beginning May 15. If you are going to be at church on Wednesday, plan on parking in either the Tremont Center lot or the Library lot.

Welcoming the Community. We will open the church for people to use the bathrooms, have a table on the patio with tote bags and information about the church and will welcome people into the parish hall to use the tables and chairs for a respite (on hot days we will hand out cups of water, too). We will welcome some of our community non-profit partners to have information tables on the patio with us.

Volunteers Needed. We need some people to set up our display and be around to welcome people to Saint Mark's. There is a SignUpGenius at the bottom of the home page of our website and a sign-up sheet in the parish hall. The Market opens at 3:30 p.m.; setup is minimal, so no need to show up much before 3:30 p.m.

The Market runs from 3:30 to 6:30 p.m. on Wednesdays from May 15 to Oct. 23.





## Culture & Artisans Fair - May 4

Saint Mark's will host the second Culture and Artisans Fair on the first Saturday in May. We will again partner with CRIS (Community Refugee and Immigration Services) and the City of Upper Arlington to showcase the artistic creations of those individuals who are in the refugee or asylum-seeking process as well as those who have become citizens after migration to avoid persecution.
